
#### DID YOU KNOW...

...that NSHA offers opportunities for students to become involved in historic preservation and many other events and activities in the town? Students of all ages can participate in various NSHA activities, including the creation of this monthly newsletter, website creation updating, audio-visual coordination at events such as History Nights, cemetery clean-up preservation, historic walks, archiving and organizing historic material, research, writing, and many other activities related to the mission of NSHA—to preserve promote and North Smithfield heritage.

Currently, NSHA President Richard Keene is mentoring a North Smithfield High School senior who has turned his love of history into his senior project, which involves working with historic cemeteries and surveying a Native American burial ground in town. # GETTING TO KNOW PELEG ARNOLD

You may know the name *Peleg Arnold* from the tavern of the same name at the top of Woonsocket Hill Road. Let's learn more about this fascinating man!

Arnold was born in 1751 in the part of Smithfield that is now North Smithfield (our town split from Smithfield in 1871). He attended Brown University, studied law, and practiced law in town. He served as a state representative, and in 1780 was colonel of the Second Regiment of the Providence County Militia in the Revolutionary War. After the war, Arnold was one of the founders of the Providence Society for the Abolition of Slavery. He was a Federalist and Rhode Island delegate to the Continental Congress in 1787, and in 1795, he was named chief justice of the Rhode Island Supreme Court, retiring in 1812.

During his life, Arnold opened and kept the Peleg Arnold Tavern, still standing in town. He also served as the president of the Smithfield Union Bank and the Smithfield Academy, and after his retirement he served again in the General Assembly representing the town, from 1817-1819. Peleg Arnold died in 1820 and is buried in the Union Cemetery.

# BE A PART OF NORTH SMITHFIELD'S 150TH BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION!

In 2021, North Smithfield celebrates 150 years as a town. NSHA is busy planning several events this year to commemorate the occasion, including the Heritage Gala on March 13, Heritage Fair in May, Spooky Nights (as co-sponsor) in October, and a Graveyard Service with our Ancestors (date TBD). In addition, NSHA is working on publishing a 150th supplement to the town's Centennial Book. Individuals and civic groups are encouraged to sponsor activities and events. The NSHA 150th Anniversary Steering Committee meets next on April 13, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. at Heritage Hall. Anyone interested is welcome to attend.
